A Message from Pastor Nerses Balabanian

But Only ONE GOD Who Would Be Man

Galatians 4:1-7

During this season, people like to send **Christmas cards** to each other. I know you enjoy receiving cards. Some people receive many while others receive just a few. The British comedian **Mr. Bean** has an episode where he goes and buys a bunch of identical Christmas cards and then sends them to his own address. It feels good to know that people love you and appreciate you. Right?

A few years ago we received an unusual Christmas card from a Christian organization and we kept it. In the front, were the pictures of nine famous people: Alexander the Great, Pharaoh, Julius Caesar, Maharishi Mahesh Yogi, Hitler, Lenin, Napoleon, Buddha and Mao Tse Tung. The inscription read: "**History is crowded with men who would be gods.**" Inside the card was the picture of baby Jesus with the writing: "**but only one God who would be man.**"

I love all Christmas cards but this one made me think. It was an unusual card. It was not even colorful. It did not have the traditional Christmas colors and the symbols. Yet it made an impact. "...**but only ONE GOD who would be man.**" This is my Christmas message to you, my dear PACC family. "**But only ONE GOD who would be man.**"

Since I started my message with Christmas cards, let me go ahead with one more. A man received a Christmas card that said: "**What if Jesus was never born?**"

It makes me think: "What if Jesus was never born." For some, it will not make any difference because for them the story of the birth of Jesus is **like a fairytale.**

The card I mentioned was sent to a **preacher** who went

to bed with this thought in his mind. He saw a very strange dream. He saw his home in the **month of December**; no decorated trees, no nativity sculptures, no star, no lights. He went to his **CDs** and could not find anything for Christmas. He looked for **Handel's Messiah** and it was not there.

Well, he jumped into his car and drove to his church. He found out that the block was empty; there was only a parking lot. He was shocked.

Then someone called him and asked him to come and help the **patient** who was **dying**. He grabbed his Bible. He arrived to the hospital, opened his Bible only to find out that there was no New Testament. The next day the patient died. The pastor wanted to prepare a message of hope. He could not find any verses for resurrection and hope.

How sad is this card. I rather go with the first one. Jesus, the Son of God, the Messiah was born. He became a human being like us so he could bring the Good News of salvation to all of us. And because of Jesus we experience King Jesus dying on the cross so we can experience His resurrection. Paul says in 1 Corinthians 15:14 "**And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith.**"

Brothers and sisters, you know what the **GOOD NEWS** is today. **Christ was born in Bethlehem, and He is ALIVE today. Yes, He is reality.**

Let us celebrate, let us worship, let us adore Him. He was born. Emmanuel, God is with us. HE IS KING OF KINGS and LORD OF LORDS.

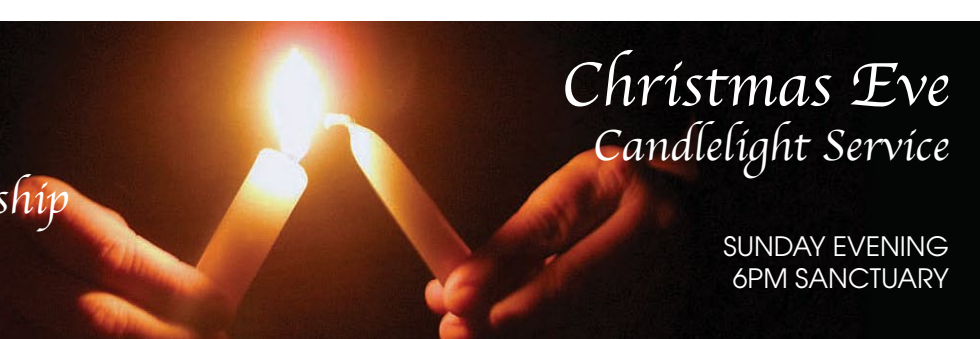

COUNCIL ACTIVITIES

On November 14 prior to the regular Council meeting, a joint meeting was held with the Board of Trustees and the Council regarding the 2018 budget. The devotion for the evening was Colossians 3:12, "You are the people of God; he loved you and chose you for his own. So then, you must clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience." With a full agenda and a long night ahead, patience was the highlighted attribute. The first order of business was the approval of the draft 2018 Budget presented on behalf of the Board of Trustees by Treasurer Patrice Ruble. The Council was provided a line-by-line discussion that highlighted any increases or decreases within specific cost centers. The Council unanimously approved the draft 2018 Budget and set the date of December 10 for presentation to the congregation at the annual budget meeting.

Immediately following the adjournment of the joint meeting, the regular Council meeting began with reports from Pastor Balabanian, Pastor Kasper, and the various committee chairs. The reports highlighted the many wonderful programs and outreach activities taking place at Pilgrim Church. For instance, the Men's Forum will be cooking and taking a Christmas meal to the Evangel Home on December 13. It is always a joyful experience for those who go. The Council also considered and unanimously approved the amendments to the bylaws as recommended by Bylaws Committee Co-Chairs Robyn Esraelian and Allison Karahadian. The next step is to present the proposed amendments to the members for consideration. The Council set the date of February 11 for a special congregational meeting allowing ample time for outreach to the members.
